Secretaries Report

Maurry read the minutes of the March 17, 2024 meeting; the Secretaries Report was accepted as read and is posted on the club web site.

Old Business

1. Field Day June 22 & 23

Dick noted we are near the peak of the sun spot cycle so propagation should be great for FD; 10 meters has been open lately.

Planned Operation: Rick on 80m; Mike on 40m; Maurry and Roger 20m; Kevin on 15 and 10m:

GOTA: Bob Harriman, N1IYV, from Baileyville will help this year; Mike will help out as needed; Mike has a tent, two radios and a generator. GOTA station is worth 100 points plus 5 points per contact.

We will begin set up on Friday afternoon around 4PM; FD operation starts at 2PM on Saturday. We will have another club meeting the Sunday before FD (June 16).

Rick has a tent; Kevin has a 13' X 5' X 6' tall utility trailer; Roger will bring his trailer, generator, and vertical antenna.

Ken will serve as safety officer with help from Pedro as needed.

Publicity for the event is worth 100 points. Maurry will send news releases to local papers and WQDY,

A visit by Phil Duggan, Section Mgr., is worth 100 points.

The Education/Information Table is worth 100 points.

A Structured Educational Activity or Speaker is worth 100 points; suggestion that American Red Cross or local ambulance demo. An AED are possibilities.

Operation of a 6m station doesn't count as a radio; free VHF station.

Power limit is 100 watts for all stations this year.

Roger will have a network logging program set up. GOTA is a separate log.

Roger will ask the Alexander Grange to put on the Saturday evening meal again this year. A vote was taken to authorize payment of \$300-\$400 to the Alexander Grange for the FD meal. All present were in favor of the proposal.

Rick will plan to download the FD message this year.

The Alexander School has been reserved for both FD and the annual Hamfest.

Rick will bring water for the FD set up on Friday.

We will need to setup accounts for both call signs on LOTW, but it has been down for some time.
